Personal impression, e.g. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• presence, dynamics</li> <li>• motivation, persuasive power</li> </ul>	
Professional impression, e.g. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• expertise, integrity</li> <li>• commitment</li> </ul>	
<b>Physical</b>	
Speech & Voice, e.g. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• volume, modulation, clarity</li> <li>• speed, fluency</li> </ul>	
Facial expression & gestures, e.g. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• posture, movement</li> <li>• expression, eye contact</li> </ul>	
<b>Slides</b>	
Design, e.g. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• colors, fonts, formatting</li> <li>• clarity, arrangement</li> <li>• amount of content per slide</li> </ul>	
Visualization (tables, diagrams, pictures), e.g. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• explanatory power, clarity</li> <li>• labeling</li> </ul>	
<b>Concept</b>	
Outline, e.g. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• partitioning (intro, main part, finish)</li> <li>• main points are clear</li> </ul>	
Argument & reasoning, e.g. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• conclusiveness, consistency</li> <li>• compactness, clarity, completeness</li> </ul>	
<b>Content</b>	
Intro, e.g. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• background &amp; motivation (reasoning)</li> <li>• benefit &amp; goals (meaning)</li> </ul>	
Outro, e.g. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• principles, tasks, results</li> <li>• problems, lessons learned</li> </ul>
